



About Gulbarga

Gulbarga, a historical city in Karnataka is known for its rich cultural heritage. For nearly 1500 years, Gulbarga has been prominent in the history and culture of the Deccan. Many great dynasties rose to power in the region in rapid succession leaving indelible marks of their glory in the history. The very first known work in Kannada literature, "Kaviraj Marga" was produced during 850 AD by Srivijay during the reign of the famous emperor Nrupatunga. Around the same time Mahaveeracharya wrote his mathematical works and Vijnaneshwara gave his Mitakshara Law - an epigraph preserved in Martur village 22 km from Gulbarga. The region has witnessed a profound revolutionary movement during 12th century led by Basaveshwara. Later Gulbarga became a bastion of the philosophical school of Sufism and produced a very eminent saint and scholar, Hazrat Khajaa Banda Nawaz in 15th century and another famous saint Sri Sharana Basaveshwara in 19th century. Gulbarga is famous for its fort which was originally conceived and constructed by Raja Gulchand and was further strengthened by Bahmani kings. The Jama Masjid located in the fort is often compared with the one in Cordova in Spain and is considered as only one of its kind in India. The places of religious and tourist interest situated in and around Gulbarga are Sri Sharanabasaveshwar Temple and the Khwaja Bande Nawaz form the pilgrimage for Hindu and Muslims respectively, Martur, Malkhed and Ganagapur (near Gulbarga), Guru Nanak Jhira, Narasimha Jhira, the oldest Madarasa of Mohammed Gawan and the Fort of Bahamani dynasty (in Bidar), Golgumbaz and Barah Kaman (in Bijapur), Kudalasangam (near Bijapur), Sri Raghavendra Temple, Mantralaya (near Raichur) and Hampi, the capital of Vijaynagar empire (near Hospet, Bellary district).
