Inaugural Ceremony Technical Sessions I & II Cultural Evening VC hosts the Dinner Highlight for the Day 2 Inaugural function of CALIBER – 2007 was held at the Panjab University auditorium on 8<sup>th</sup> February 2007 at 11am. The Convention was inaugurated by His Excellency Gen. (Retd.) S F Rodrigues, Governor of Punjab and Administrator, Union Territory of Chandigarh. After Saraswati Vandana, Prof. R C Sobti, Vice Chancellor, Panjab University, Chandigarh welcomed the dignitaries on the dais and the delegates from India and abroad. In his welcome address, he emphasized the need for timely access to quality information. He further emphasized that the professional focus must be on latest trends in ICT applications, information management and knowledge networking. He appreciated the role of INFLIBNET Centre in providing elbow support to university libraries throughout India.

Speaking on this occasion, **His Excellency Gen. (Retd.) S F Rodrigues** said that although change is an effect of initiatives somewhere yet people have the tendency to resist change. There is a need for attitudinal change the library and information services must be based on feedback from users.

Government of India is spending huge amounts of money on library and information services through various agencies but the usage feedback is not available. Thousands of libraries are not being used optimally. It is good to talk about knowledge management and National Knowledge Commission but we should also learn to focus our attention on application of knowledge. We must know what we are going to do with the available knowledge. Creativity, innovation and equity are the emerging issues need continuous attention. We must look beyond knowledge and become sensitive to information needs of respective communities. Our educational system must be spiritually and culturally very strong. There should be a shift from rote learning to critical thinking. We should follow holistic approach to put things together and emphasis must be on using information and knowledge for effective decision making.

**Sh. Prem Chand**, Scientist-C, INFLIBNET and Convener of CALIBER-2007, briefed about the convention - its theme and sub themes. He informed that till today INFLIBNET has organized 13 National and 4 International conventions. Panjab University, Chandigarh, is hosting the 5<sup>th</sup> international convention on the cutting-edge theme - "Information and Knowledge Management in the Networked World". He further told that out of 160 papers received, 76 full text papers and 40 abstracts have been accepted for publication and presentation. A total of 400 delegates from India and abroad are attending this convention.

**Sh. Manoj Kumar K**, Acting Director, INFLIBNET Centre highlighted the role and activities of INFLIBNET and expressed that it will have to initiate new programme to face the challenges of future and will play a major role in the light of recommendations of National Knowledge Commission. He also informed that the Panjab University is one of the top ten universities for making highest use of e-resources provided by the INFLIBNET under UGC Infonet e-journal consortium

On this occasion, a souvenir and the conference proceedings were also released by His Excellency Gen. (Retd.) S F Rodrigues, Governor of Punjab. Dr. V K Anand, Organsing Secretary CALIBER – 2007 and Librarian, A.C.Joshi Library, Panjab University, Chandigarh proposed vote of thanks. Mrs Jaspal Kaur, Librarian, Dev Samaj College, Chandigarh conducted the stage.
