Pre-Convention Tuorial

Pre-convention tutorial will be offered on the following topics:

- 1) ETD and Shodhganga: A Reservoir of Indian Theses
- 2) SOUL 2.0 and N-LIST Programme

The tutorial will focus on the practical aspects of installation, configuration and operation of the DSpace for ETDs, an open source institutional repository software. The participants will be provided insights on ETD and Shodhganga. Parallel tutorials will be organized on SOUL 2.0 and N-LIST Programme. Participants will be imparted training and installation of SOUL 2.0 and features and functionalities of its different modules. Participants will be given insight into N-LIST Programme and e-resources made accessible to colleges through this programme along with guidelines for joining the programme. All tutorials are free to the participants registered for CALIBER 2011. All tutorials will be open to the entire academic community of the Goa University, Goa.

How to Submit Paper?

Papers, composed preferably in MS-Word or compatible format, can be submitted online at http://www.inflibnet.ac.in/ caliber 2011 / ocs / openconf.php. The length of the paper should not be more than 5000 words. All necessary inputs should be provided at the time of submitting the papers. The references in the paper should be cited according to the guidelines and examples explained on the convention website based on the A. P. A. Style Manual. Authors are advised to follow the standard citation practices and cite articles, chapters in books/ conference proceedings, Web sites that are used in compilation of their articles. The paper should neither be published anywhere nor should have been kept under consideration for publication elsewhere. A passport size photograph(s) of author(s) is required to be submitted with the paper either in print or in digital format. The authors of the accepted papers need to transfer the copyright to the conference organizers for publishing the paper into the convention proceedings and the INFLIBNET Institutional Repository. The authors will also be free to upload their published papers into any institutional repositories.

About INFLIBNET

The Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET) Centre was established in May 1996 as an independent, autonomous Inter-University Centre (IUC) of the University Grants Commission (UGC). Major activities and services of the Centre include automation of academic libraries and information centres, creation of union databases of resources available in academic libraries, promote resource sharing among academic libraries, promote information access and transfer, support scholarship, learning and academic pursuits. The Centre acts as a nodal agency for networking of libraries and information centres in universities, institutions of higher learning and R & D institutions in India with an aim to promote scholarly communication.

The technology being a driving force in the contemporary education system, the Centre, on behalf of the UGC, has taken-up a number of initiatives for the benefit of the academic community. These initiatives include i) UGC-Infonet Connectivity Programme that provides for networking of university campuses and Internet connectivity; ii) UGC-Infonet Digital Library Consortium that extends access to selected scholarly electronic journals and databases to the universities in different disciplines; iii) Shodhganga: Indian Electronic Theses and Dissertation, that enables online submission of theses and dissertations by research scholars in digital repository set-up at the INFLIBNET Centre; iv) Open Journals System @ INFLIBNET that facilitates faculty and researchers in Indian universities to launch their open access journals using INFLIBNET hosting facilities; and v) Access management technologies that facilitate users to access eresources irrespective of their physical location. Besides, the Centre has recently launched a project entitled "National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content" (N-LIST) that provides access to electronic journals and electronic books to eligible colleges.

About Goa University

Goa University was established in 1985 by incorporating the Centre for Post Graduate Instruction & Research (CPIR) of the University of Bombay. Over the last 25 years, the University has steadily expanded its reach, both in terms of the number of colleges affiliated, as well as the diversity of courses offered. The University has 24 Post Graduate Departments and 3 Centres that offer academic programmes leading to Masters, M.Phil and Ph.D. degrees across six faculties – Faculty of Languages & Literature, Faculty of Social Sciences, Faculty of Natural Sciences, Faculty of Life Sciences & Environment, Faculty of Management Studies, and Faculty of Commerce. The Post Graduate Departments and Centres at the University and the 47 affiliating professional and non-professional colleges provide diverse learning opportunities through degree, diploma and certificate courses,

reaching out to students across the state as well as to students from other parts of the country.

Geographically, Goa is located in an ecologically sensitive region along the Western Ghats and the Arabian Sea. Goa University has appropriately emerged as an important resource centre for research in the field of flora and fauna endemic to this region, as well as the marine environment.

Goa University provides a vibrant learning atmosphere for students. Its green campus is renowned for its biodiversity. The students' hostels, facilitation centre, sports and fitness centre, common Internet access facilities and the well equipped library provide the requisite amenities for students to pursue their academic goals amidst an invigorating atmosphere.

Goa and its Climate

The Climate during March in Goa is near perfect with cloudless blue skies, warm but not oppressively hot days, and calm seas. By mid-March the humidity starts to rise as the monsoon begins to approach second time during the year. Summer in Goa sets in by mid-March and remains till the end of June. Though strong heat wave conditions are not encountered, the temperature may rise up to 40 degrees on some days. The average daily sunshine is 9 to 10 hours in summer. The breeze that blows from the seaside continuously has a soothing effect. Light cotton clothes will be comfortable for the hot and humid climate of Goa.

How to Reach?

Air: Gao is very well connected with air network and most important cities of the country are well connected with it. The Dabolim Airport of Goa is located 30 km from Panaji, the capital city of the state. It is situated near Vasco-da-Gama, the port town of Goa. The airport is owned by Indian Navy and various national and international flights are operated. Some of the major airlines which have regular flights to and from Goa; those are Indian Airlines, Jet Airways, Spicejet, JetLite, Kingfisher Red, Kingfisher Airlines, Paramount Airways, IndiGo Airlines and MDLR Airlines.

Road: Goa is connected by good motorable roads with all the major towns in India via the National Highways NH4A, NH17, NH17A.

Train: Goa is directly connected with Ahmedabad, Bangalore, Bhopal, Chennai, Delhi, Emakulam, Gandhidham, Jaipur, Jodhpur, Mangalore, Miraj, Mumbai, Pune, Rajkot Thiruvananthapuram and other cities by rail. Convenient stations in Goa are Margao, Vasco, Karmali and Thivim. Margao (Madgaon) is the main station where all trains stop. Express train of the Konkan Railway line connects Goa with Delhi, Mumbai, Thiruvananthapuram and Vadodara.
